Future Trends in Process Safety

John Bresland (former Head of CSB)

Based on lessons learned during a 35-year career in the chemical industry, and 10 years as a Board Member and Chairman of the United States Chemical Safety Board, Mr. Bresland will present his thoughts on the key factors for developing a world-class process safety program.

Maintaining and managing process safety competence in oil & gas industry

A key ingredient of process safety management is the availability of highly qualified professionals in that area. The principles of effective competence management are highlighted and its application is explained. Challenges related to successful process safety management are discussed with some examples.

'Professional Process Safety Engineer' registration: IChemE's response to a societal imperative for competent practitioners in process safety

There is a worldwide shortage of engineers with expertise in the field of process safety engineering. Moreover, there is general concern (including among regulators) that some who claim to be 'safety' engineers do not have the requisite breadth or depth of competence to operate professionally in the field of process safety. Unlike occupational safety, there is no recognised professional standard of process safety engineering excellence. This presentation demonstrates how IChemE is establishing an international professional engineer registration based on a robust standard that defines process safety engineer competences.
